IMPORTANT: FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION

The following deadline dates will be strictly adhered to in processing financial aid applications for academic year 1982-1983.

February 15, 1982

Deadline date for submitting Financial Aid Forms (FAF) to the College Scholarship Service.

Your 1981 income information may be estimated on the financial aid form if you have not completed your 1040 or 1040A income tax form. If your income on the Financial Aid Form is different than what is finally reported on your tax form, required adjustments will be made by the Financial Aid Office.

February 15, 1982

Deadline date for submitting the Salve Regina College Financial Aid application to the Financial Aid Office.

March 15, 1982

Deadline date for submitting a signed photocopy of your parents' 1981 1040 or 1040A income tax form to the Financial Aid Office. Independent students must submit their own income tax forms by the same deadline date.

At the Annual Meeting of the Martin Luther King Center on January 27, Katy Ostrander was elected President of the Board. The Center dates from the 1940's and is the only institution in Newport County reflecting the "settlement house" phase of social service. Programs in day care, recreation, education and services to the elderly are its most significant offerings to the community. Although there is a focus on service to low-income and minority populations, the Center is an integrated agency in staff, board and clientele.

Marge Krieger has been appointed to serve on a planning committee for the Annual Symposium of the Rhode Island Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers. The Symposium is held in the spring of each year and attracts hundreds of Rhode Island social workers.

NEW ENGLAND/QUEBEC EXCHANGE PROGRAM INAUGURATED

On Thursday, January 28, 1982, a formal signing ceremony at the Boston Copley Plaza Hotel marked the official beginning of the YEAR ABROAD PROGRAM between French Canada and the New England States. Civic and academic dignitaries of both countries toasted the unique opportunity which now exists for students from twenty-two New England and ten Quebec colleges and universities to exchange places in a mutual broadening of cultural and academic horizons. Senator Robert J. McKenna, a prime mover in the project, represented the State of Rhode Island. Sister Theresa McQueeney, also in attendance, will be the program coordinator for Salve Regina - The Newport College, one of the charter member colleges.
