The John E. Fogarty Branch of the Rhode Island Council for Exceptional Children is sponsoring a public forum on a critical issue in special education. The forum-"The Impact of Reaganomics on Special Education - Federal, State and Local Response," will be held on Saturday, March 13, 1982 from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. in O'Hare Academic Center.

A bipartisan panel of federal and state representatives will respond to issues regarding federal changes which effect the education of all handi-capped children. "EDUCATION VIA RADIO" SPOTLIGHTS FORMER SALVE PRESIDENT AND FOUNDER OF ST. GEORGE'S AND PORTSMOUTH ABBEY

Distinguished Newport educators, Sister Hilda Miley, R.S.M. and Reverend John Diman, O.S.B. are the historical subjects of the upcoming "Education via Radio" program Wednesday, March 24, from 9 to 10 a.m., on WADK, radio 1540.

Sister Hilda Miley was the second president of Salve Regina College and Father Diman established St. George's Preparatory School, Middletown as well as Portsmouth Abbey and Diman Vocational School in Fall River.

Sister Rosalia Flaherty, member of the Board of Trustees, was dean of Salve Regina from 1957 to 1967, and James Garman, instructor of history at Portsmouth Abbey, are the scheduled guests. They will discuss the accomplishments of the noted educators.
