2. Stay on Memorial Blvd. to Valley Rd. (Rt 214).
3. Valley Road to Green End Ave. (1st light). Left on Green End Avenue (bear right up hill) to West Main Road. (Rt. 114).
4. Through light at 114, on Admiral Kalbfus Road., go to rotary.
5. Go half way around rotary, cross railroad track, to gate 1. (signs posted).
6. Through gate 1 to Perry St., (1st right).
7. Right on Perry St. to Porter Ave.
