THIRTY-THIRD COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES AT SALVE REGINA COLLEGE TO BE HELD ON LAWN OF O'HARE ACADEMIC CENTER

Salve Regina - The Newport College will hold its thirty-third commencement exercises Sunday, May 22, at 2:00 p.m. on the east lawn of O'Hare Academic Center. Five-hundred-fifteen students will receive degrees in the College's first outdoor graduation since 1977.

Anne Rebuzzini, a special education major with a minor in elementary education, is this year's valedictorian. The 1983 graduating class is the largest in the College's history. Two-hundred-twenty-five students will receive master's degrees, 278 will receive baccalaureate degrees and 11 will be awarded associate degrees.
