SALVE REGINA TO HOST FIRST R.I. INTERCOLLEGIATE WOMEN'S DOUBLES GRASS TENNIS TOURNAMENT AT TENNIS HALL OF FAME



Salve Regina will host the first Rhode Island Intercollegiate Women's Doubles Grass Tennis Tournament on Sunday, October 14, 11:00 a.m. at the International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport.

Salve Regina along with Bryant College, Providence College, Rhode Island College, Roger Williams College and the University of Rhode Island, will each send three doubles teams to the tournament. The thirty-six players will compete in three flights.

The single-elimination tournament will utilize United States Tennis Association rules without officials. The Van Alen Simple Scoring system will be used. Trophies, supplied by the R.I. Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, will be awarded to the top three schools.

Paul Cardoza, Director of the Physical Education Department at Salve Regina, is Director and Coordinator of the Women's Tournament. Cardoza, who is also women's varsity tennis coach at Salve Regina stated, "This is a great opportunity not only for the women to compete, but for them to compete on grass in such a legendary setting as the Hall of Fame." The Tennis Hall of Fame will provide tournament participants with tours of the facility.

The Rhode Island Intercollegiate Women's Doubles Grass Tennis Tournament is open to spectators. Admission is free.

DANCE MARATHON

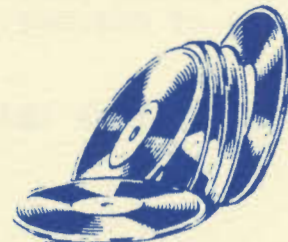

FACULTY NEWS

Dr. Thomas Day, Chairman of the Music Department, composed the fanfares and interludes performed at the special College Convocation held on September 19, commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Salve Regina College Charter. The music lent a special touch to a memorable event.

Jay Lacouture, Chairman of the Art Department at Salve Regina, will be a visiting artist at the American Craft Museum in New York City from October 16-18. He is one of six ceramic artists invited by the museum to participate in its "Meet the Artist" series. These artists will discuss their work as well as demonstrate raku and smoke techniques.

Mr. Lacouture's visit is in conjunction with the traveling ceramic exhibition from Raku and Smoke North America, a contemporary exhibit which he originally curated at the Newport Art Museum for six weeks last spring. Twenty-two pieces from the Newport show were chosen by Mr. Lacouture and Paul Smith, director of the American Craft Museum for the New York exhibition which will run through November 3, 1984.

Sister Arlene Woods of the Art Department is now showing her work at a one-person show in New York at St. John University's Gallery 300. The exhibition, entitled "European Travel Series," will run through the beginning of October.
