SOCIAL WORK ACCREDITATION

The Council on Social Work Education, the national standard-setting organization of the profession, has announced the initial accreditation for four years of Salve Regina's Social Work program. Beginning with the class of 1984, Salve Regina graduates with a B.S. degree in Social Work are: eligible to apply for social work licenses in those states which have licensing procedures (Massachusetts, for one), may be admitted to graduate schools of social work on an "advanced standing" (one year) basis, and are invited to join the National Association of Social Workers as full voting members.

BIOLOGY DEPARTMENT

The sessions covered such areas as: Oncogenes & Growth Factors; The Cancer Cell & Hereditary Cancer, Tumor Promoters & Carcinogenesis; and Monoclonal Antibodies.
