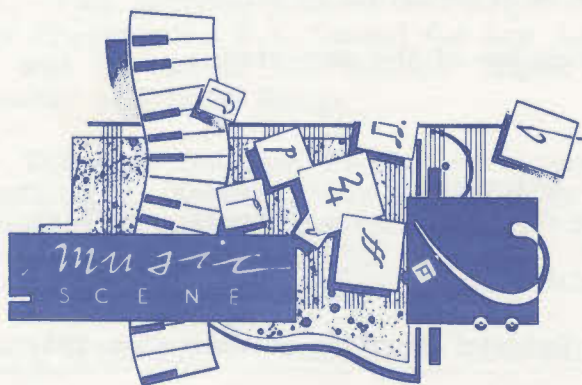

### CHERYL WHEELER TO BE FEATURED AT NOON CONCERT SERIES

Salve Regina's Music Department will open the Wednesday Noon Concert Series on October 7 with local singer/songwriter Cheryl Wheeler. The one-hour concert will be held in Cecilia Hall, located in Carey Mansion on Ruggles Avenue.

A popular local artist, Cheryl Wheeler has also achieved national acclaim for such works as "Cheryl Wheeler," a 1986 North Star release; "Newport Songs," a four-song EP record; "New England Christmastime," an instrumental album of traditional carols and melodies; and her most recent recording, "Half-A-Book," a 1987 North Star release. She has performed with such notable artists as Aztec Two-Step, Donovan, Jonathon Edwards, Arlo Guthrie, Gordon Lightfoot, Tom Rush and Livingston Taylor.

The concert, which is free of charge and open to the public, begins promptly at noon. Patrons are invited to bring a lunch and relax during this month's musical offering. The series will continue throughout the academic year on the first Wednesday of each month.

## ART DEPARTMENT RECEIVES NASAD ACCREDITATION

After a rigorous curriculum and facilities review, Salve Regina's Art Department has been granted a five-year associate membership into the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD). NASAD, established in 1944, is the only accrediting agency covering art and design education that is recognized by the Council on Post-Secondary Accreditation and the United States Department of Education.

The NASAD membership includes major art and design schools as well as college and university art and design departments from all regions of the United States. Less than 20 undergraduate liberal arts colleges have met NASAD standards and have achieved accreditation.
