CHRISTIAN LIFE CENTER: Happening No. 6

A movie and panel discussion on the subject of prisons in contemporary society will be presented this coming Wednesday, October 31, at 7:30 p.m., in room 260 of O'Hare Academic Center. The program will be the fourth and last program in the Christian Life Center's "Right to Life" series.

The film is a documentary on the Attica, N. Y., prison uprising which captured national attention two years ago.

Participants in the panel discussion will be: Mr. William Pimental, member of the Board of Directors of the R.I. Chapter of the National Prison Reform Association; State Senator Guido Canulla of Tiverton; Mr. Paul Desmaris of Our Lady of Providence Seminary; and Mr. Francis Foley, Deputy Warden at the R.I. Adult Correctional Institution.

The program is open to the Salve Regina community and the public. There is no admission charge. Refreshments will be served after the conclusion of the program.
