SALVE SLATES TALKS  
ON BYRON, COUNCIL

Paul vanK Thomson, vice president for academic affairs at Providence College, noted speaker and author, will deliver Salve Regina College's third Mother Hilda Miley Memorial Lecture, Wednesday, October 26, at 7:30 p.m. His topic will be "Byron and the Satanic School of Poetry." The public is invited to attend.

A member of the Modern Language Association of America, the National Council of Teachers of English, and of the Authors Guild of America, Dr. Thomson is the author of Francis Thompson: A Critical Biography.

On Tuesday, October 25, the college will be host to Rev. Robert Winter, rector of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Warren, who will deliver an informal studio lecture at 7 p.m. in Ochre Court. A member of the Anglican Ecumenical Commission of Rhode Island and an observer at the Vatican Council, Father Winter will discuss his "Reactions to Vatican II."
