This January Salve Regina College will start a series of three-week seminars which will give you a better understanding of Ben Franklin and all the men and forces that forged our country. Called "Education for Our Bicentennial", this series will trace America's birth and development and bring our country's past to life all over again, not just in dry "founding Fathers" terms, but in terms of the real people and real issues involved.

The program is in three parts tracing various aspects of American independence. You may enroll in just one series of lectures of all three. Tuition for each segment is \$250. Room and board for the three week period is available for \$120. A \$20 deposit is required with the pre-registration and an additional \$15 deposit is necessary for those requesting accommodations. All deposits will be credited to the total cost of the program.
