FATHER BOUYER SLATED
TO SPEAK AT SALVE REGINA

Rev. Louis Bouyer, internationally acclaimed scholar and author and currently visiting professor of Catholic Studies at Brown University, will speak at Salve Regina College, Tuesday, December 5, at 7:30 p.m. in Ochre Court. He will consider The Future of the Eucharist. The public is invited.

Joining Father Bouyer in a panel discussion following his paper will be: Rev. Richard C. Boulet, O.P., visiting professor of Sacred Theology at Providence College and author of The Sacramental Grace of the Priesthood; Ade Bethune, noted liturgical artist; Rev. John P. Reilly, chairman, division of theology and philosophy, Salve Regina; and Sister Mary Eloise, R.S.M., professor of theology and philosophy at the college.

Born in Paris and educated at Paris and Strasbourg Universities, Louis Bouyer was a minister of the Lutheran church before his conversion to Roman Catholicism soon after which he became a priest of the Oratory. From 1945 to 1962, he was on the theology faculty of the Catholic University of Paris. Since then he has devoted his time to writing; to date, forty of his books are in print.

He acted as consultant to the Preparatory Commission of the Council for Studies, is now a member of the Consilium ad exorquendum s. constitutionem de liturgia and of the Joint Roman Catholic and Anglican Committee appointed by the Pope and Canterbury.
