PROVIDENCE MAYOR ON SALVE CAMPUS

IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr. of Providence will be a guest on campus at Salve Regina College in Newport on Wednesday, May 15. Mayor Doorley will lunch with members of the faculty, student body, and administration at one o'clock. He will tour the campus and then at 3:00 P.M. will address the State and Local Government Course on the role of the modern mayor.

Mayor Doorley is the last of this year's series of Rhode Island political leaders who have participated in the American Government courses at the College. Early in the academic year Senator J. Joseph Garrahy, Democratic State Chairman, and Mr. Howard E. Russell, Republican State Chairman, addressed the national government course. This semester Governor John H. Chafee, former Governor Dennis J. Roberts, and several other guest lecturers addressed the State and Local Government course.

Prof. Robert J. McKenna, assistant professor of politics and philosophy at Salve Regina, who is the teacher in the course, instituted the series of guest lectures in order to bring the world of practical politics into the classroom.
