SALVE NURSING HEAD ATTENDS DALLAS CONVENTION IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Sister Mary Augustine SanSouci, R.S.M., Director of the Division of Nursing at Salve Regina College, Newport, R. I., will head the team of seven official delegates to the House of Delegates of the American Nurses Association Biennial Convention in Dallas, Texas May 13-17. The House of Delegates is the official voting body of the association, and all matters of importance pertaining to nursing education, practice, and general welfare are brought to it for deliberation and decision.

On Friday, May 10, Sister Mary Augustine will serve as a member of a reaction panel during a special program in Dallas which will bring together presidents and executive secretaries of state nurses associations. The main speaker at this meeting will be Eloise R. Lewis, R.N., Ed.D., Dean, School of Nursing, University of North Carolina at Greensboro, whose topic will be: "Role of the State Nurses Associations in Effecting Change in Nursing Education."
