Dear Sir:

Owing to my long illness & consequent loss of time & money and to the general impossibility to make collections I find myself exceedingly short of funds, and am forced to ask accommodation of you if in your power to grant same. I have had a large force of men at work on Mr Ogden Gorlet's house and have completed work amounting in all to some 1200 or 1500 as follows - Walls & Ceilings & Closets Elevator shaft & basement walls & ceilings painted woodwork painted & varnished, Cellar whitewashed including new bins lately put up and am now building up numerous floors & putting them in condition to harden & be ready for finishing coat later on. Now if you could let me have 600 or 700 by Saturday, it would assist me greatly in meeting my heavy payroll on that day, & also one other payment I am obliged to make on Monday. Hoping to receive a favorable reply I am Very Truly Yours Joseph Mayer
