Work of the Year Ending October 31st, 1896.

There were, during the past year, in our seven Lodging Houses, **5,830** different boys and girls; **256,839** meals and **179,930** lodgings were supplied. In the twenty day and thirteen evening schools were **13,302** children, who were taught, and partly fed and partly clothed, **759,704** meals being supplied; **2,256** were sent to homes and employment, and restored to friends in both the East and the West; **2,927** were aided with food, medicine, etc., through the "Sick Children's Mission;" **6,254** children enjoyed the benefits of the "Summer Home" at Bath Beach, L. I. (averaging **625** per week); **6,132** mothers and sick infants were sent to the "Health Home" at Coney Island; **62** girls have been instructed in the use of the sewing machine in the Elizabeth Home for Girls and the Industrial Schools; **19** girls were taught type writing, and **213** boys were trained at the Farm School and placed in homes. **\$3,791.40** have been deposited in the Penny Savings Bank. Total number under charge of the Society during the year, **37,155.**
