Two programs involve travel.

<u>Druids Legacy</u> is a study tour of Ireland, Wales, and England, an interdisciplinary study of the cultures as they have evolved from their Druid ancestry. Students will earn four credits in either history, art, music, philosophy, or religious studies.

Instructors are Glenn Giuttari (music), Sr. Solina (art), and Dr. Hersh (philosophy).

Three SRC students and Sister Norma Orme (Spanish) leave for San Pedro Sula, Honduras on December 29. They will spend the interim period assisting the victims of Hurricane Fifi in that country.

Donna Baehr and Ellen Peterson ('75), Spanish minors and student nurses, will work in a temporary hospital in Choloma, a town that lost almost 4,000 people and 80% of its children. Christine Zaremski ('76), a Spanish major, will work with children orphaned by the hurricane. These children have swelled the numbers of the Hogar in San Pedro Sula, a home for children of broken families.

Sister Norma has been assigned to La Iglesia Ambulante (the Church on Wheels), whose members biring food, clothing, and spiritual assistance to families isolated in the mountains surrounding the Sula Valley.

The three students and Sister Norma will reside with the Sisters of Mercy at Instituto San Vicente de Paul, in San Pedro Sula.

Tutors Sought

Project Upward Bound, a federally-funded program which seeks to assist educationally-deprived high school students, is seeking tutors in the Newport area to help students in all subject areas.

Tutors will be required to travel to the students, meeting them at a mutually agreed upon time and place. The rate of pay is \$5.00 per hour for certified teachers and graduate students, and \$3.50 for undergraduates.

Applications may be obtained in the Placement Office, Room 121.

Withdrawal Forms Available

Students who wish to withdraw from a course without academic penalty must be certain that they have completed the necessary Course Withdrawal Form before the last day of classes. The forms may be obtained from the Dean of Student's office. Without an official notice of course withdrawal, an "F" will appear on the transcript.

Also, students who are withdrawing from SRC should arrange for a brief "exit interview" with the Dean of Students.
