## *The University Seal*

1934

At its first meeting on July 27, 1934, at St. Xavier Convent, the Board of Directors voted to accept the seal of Salve Regina College. The seal depicts Our Lady of Mercy enclosed in a circle and standing before a cross. Around Our Lady's head is inscribed the motto: Maria Spes Nostra, Mary our Hope. On one side of the base is the lamp of learning, and on the other, the book of learning. This seal, according to the by-laws, shall be affixed to all official documents and decrees prepared by Salve Regina University.

Kenneth Anthony Angell is a gentle shepherd, who ministers to his flock, while leading through a personal example of humility, compassion, and joy, enriching the lives of those he serves. As he travels the path defined by that earlier shepherd of ancient Jerusalem, he also exemplifies the words of the poet of another land: "Good, the more communicated, the more abundant grows."

Having begun his apprenticeship to the Church as a Rhode Island schoolboy, he devoted his early years to the quieter offices of a parish priest before being called to the burdens of leadership. Upon the august occasion of his episcopacy, after donning the heavy miter and taking up the traditional crosier, this pastor of the people chose a modest personal motto from Psalm 100: "Serve the Lord with Gladness." And, indeed, he has done so.

Today, as the Eighth Bishop of Burlington, Vermont, this most reverent of men takes on the many perplexing issues of a contemporary society, abjuring the deceptive comforts of careful neutrality. Throughout his diocese, all generations in his care profit from his respect for life, his campaigns against violence, his advocacy for women, and his work to sustain the seminarians who seek his guidance.

Always the teacher, this designee inspires through his gentle stories, as well as his public oratory, while nourishing the souls in need within his church and reaching out to her neighbors of other faiths. Thus, through embracing the multi-faceted world of today, he sets his people on the path to a tomorrow of understanding and acceptance. In so doing, he opens wide the gates of this house, for all to enter and serve.

With gratitude for the gladness of his service, as he guides all who would enter through his *portae spiritualae*, we hereby confer upon teacher, servant, and shepherd, Kenneth Anthony Angell the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*, with all its attendant rights and privileges, on this twenty-first day of May, 2000.

Eileen Theresa Farley is a builder of bridges. Through her endeavors to provide learning for all, this leader has forged educational connections that surpass the most notable spans of stone and steel in our physical world. During a career of significant achievement, her educational bridges have been creatively engineered and patiently constructed to connect generations of students to a future of promise. Like the poet of Amherst, she has “dwel[t] in possibility.”

Having pursued undergraduate and graduate studies in the classical disciplines of mathematics and philosophy, this honorand devoted seventeen years, as a Sister of Charity, to Elizabeth Seton College, beginning in the classroom and rising to the Presidency, a duty that she fulfilled with distinction. Now a New Englander, she has presided over Bristol Community College for more than two decades of growth and change, adding new academic programs, constructing centers for learning, creating partnerships with area high schools and businesses, establishing an unprecedented endowment; and introducing articulation agreements with four-year colleges, including this University.

Convinced that her institution's strength is interconnected with the people it serves, this designee has worked to attract new business to the area, battled to extend educational opportunity to welfare mothers, lobbied Beacon Hill to maintain affordable tuition, and created scholarship funds with hard-won corporate grants. Throughout these successes, President Farley has steadfastly called into service her innovative ideas and persuasive eloquence out of true concern for the well being of each student.

Irving Allan Wiseman is a maker of shoes. DARRELL JENKS

*Dissertation Topic*

ETHICS IN SCIENCE FICTION: BUTLER, WELLS, AND STAPLESON

Mr. Jenks examines the ethical positions of three authors representing the utopian, dystopian, and religious sub-genres of science fiction. He explores how these authors employed science fiction to express their views about the influence of technological change on society and how a relationship between humanity and technology is forged.

JOHN MICHAEL KIRBY

*Dissertation Topic*

AN INTERDISCIPLINARY MODEL TO EVALUATE ALTERNATIVE ROLES OF MILITARY RESERVE COMPONENTS IN MODERN AMERICAN SOCIETY.

Mr. Kirby's dissertation focuses on a specific American civil-military dilemma: military efficiency versus social legitimacy. He examines different models for achieving the best balance between efficiency, requiring active forces, and legitimacy, which is demonstrated to be dependent on reserve forces.

PETER H. LIOTTA

*Dissertation Topic*

THE ICON AND THE AXE: AN ECOLOGICAL APPROACH TO YUGOSLAV DISINTEGRATION: 1991-1998.

Mr. Liotta's dissertation delineates the social, economic/political, and historical/religious factors that contributed to the disintegration of the former Yugoslavia and to the continued instability in the Balkans. He examines how alternate *zeitgeists*, coercive diplomacy, political and military strategy, economic change, and religious differences have contributed and continue to contribute to the area's uncertain future.

MARGARET M. MATHIAS

*Dissertation Topic*

EXPANDING THE TECHNOLOGY DEBATE THROUGH THE INVESTIGATION OF HUMOR IN RECENT ART: 1950S TO 1990S.

Mrs. Mathias' dissertation explores the use of art and humor as tools for understanding technology and its effects on people and society. She examines contemporary artists and their work for an insightful glimpse at how irony, satire, slapstick, and other forms of humor have become vehicles through which artists respond to technology and inform us of its impact.

DEBORAH VERY KING

*Dissertation Topic*

THE TREATMENT OF IMPERILED INFANTS: MEDICAL, ETHICAL, AND SOCIAL PERSPECTIVES.

Mrs. King's dissertation examines neonatologists' beliefs about what factors influence their decision-making in situations where the use of advanced technology is required to save the lives of imperiled infants. Using both qualitative and quantitative analysis, she explores the factors that determine whether or not extraordinary means will be utilized to sustain an imperiled infant's life.

DANIEL VIVEIROS

*Dissertation Topic*

THE RISE AND FALL OF THE AMERICAN DINER: 1920-1960.

Mr. Viveiros' dissertation examines the influence of technological and cultural change on the rise and fall of the American diner. He documents the factors that gave rise to its prominence and discusses its demise in the context of changing cultural values that embraced fast food, the emergence of a new business model that encouraged standardization, and political and social change that contributed to society's growing disaffection with traditional values and customs.

## *Academic Regalia*

When Universities were taking form in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries, they were under the jurisdiction of the Church. Most of those studying were clerks in Holy Orders, monks, or priests. They wore a habit or cloak to which was attached a cowl or hood. This could be pulled up over the head or thrown back, according to weather. Gowns were necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings, and hoods served to cover the tonsured head before the use of the skull cap.

Today, the academic costume of cap, gown, and hood has taken on a symbolic meaning. Colors and shapes conform to a generally accepted code and indicate the faculty conferring the degree and the kind of degree conferred. Gowns for the Bachelor's degree are worn closed and are distinguished by their long pointed sleeves. Master's degree gowns are designed to be worn open. They have very long sleeves, oblong in shape. Gowns for the doctoral degree, usually black, are also designed to be worn open and have velvet panels. Three velvet bars are stitched to the upper part of the full, bell-shaped sleeves.

Hoods are trimmed with a slim strip of velvet to indicate the specific faculty awarding the degree. The colored lining is the official color of the institution conferring the degree. Hoods may be trimmed to represent the following academic areas:

Arts, Letters, Humanities — White  
Business Administration — Light Brown  
Education — Light Blue  
Fine Arts — Brown

Musical Arts — Pink  
Philosophy — Dark Blue  
Science — Golden Yellow  
Theology — Scarlet



## *The Mace*

The mace and its bearer represent a custom that dates back to the Middle Ages. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, it has become a symbol of office carried by the procession leader. In the academic world, the mace signifies teaching authority.

The Salve Regina University mace was designed by Rhode Island sculptor Paul A. Cavanagh as an octagonal, formalized flower. The staff of ebony represents “lignum vitae” — the tree of life. A circle of eight rigid geometric forms of silver, peaked with pyramids of lapis lazuli are representative of the Virtues. The Intellectual and Moral Virtues enable one to lead a fruitful and good life. The extending leaves of blossom deriving from the silver forms are symbolic of one’s development in the world. An inner circle of leaves, in close embrace with the central form, and pistil-like cruciform with crown, suggest one’s development in love of Christ and the cross.

## *The President’s Medallion*

The sterling silver medallion worn by the University President at all formal academic functions symbolizes the leadership and authority of the institution’s highest office.

Handcrafted by John Cavanagh, the design is based on the University shield which symbolizes the commitment of the Sisters of Mercy to Salve Regina University, the dedication to learning by all members of the Salve community, and the unending search for wisdom that flows from the knowledge of the liberal scholar. Each link of the chain is a “Mercy Cross,” with a crown superimposed over the face of each cross.
