President's Council for Development Formed

"Salve Regina College looks forward to increased enrollment and expanded academic programs in the coming decade," Sister Lucille McKillop told the College's newly formed President's Council for Development at a luncheon meeting August 12th at Ochre Court.

"Now that the College has proven itself a vital member of the Newport community and as a quality institution of higher education, it's time to focus our attention on long-range planning and development," she said.

The Council will act as an advisory group to the President and will work closely with the College's Board of Trustees to help Salve Regina evaluate its present position and determine its long-range objectives.

With nearly half of Salve Regina's 1,500 students enrolled in programs that did not exist 10 years ago, one of the group's specific goals will be to advise the College on curricula changes geared to meet the community's needs, as well as increase enrollment.

According to Sister Lucille, Salve Regina has grown so rapidly in the past three years that it now faces what she termed the "problems of success" ranging from limited parking areas to the need for increased academic facilities.

Raymond W. Caine, Vice President of Rhode Island Blue Cross and Blue Shield, is Chairman of the President's Council.

Other members are: Vice Admiral John T. Hayward, (Ret.), formerly President of the Naval War College and Vice President International of General Dynamics Corporation;

Dr. Robert F. Delaney, Forrest Sherman Professor of Public Diplomacy at the Naval War College, and past President of the Thunderbird School of International Management; former Salve Regina College Dean, Sister Mary Rosalia Flaherty, R.S.M., Consultant to the Rhode Island Department of Education; Willard H. Gage, Jr. Vice President, Rhode Island Hospital Trust National Bank; Joseph H. Hagan, Special Assistant to the Director of the National Endowment for the Humanities, Washington, and Walter J. V. Litwin, National Home Builders Association, Washington, D. C.
