A Salve Regina College Summer Session workshop in liturgy and song for church organists, choir directors, lectors and commentators, dancers and accompanists, will be held this week (July 6-10) on the College's seaside campus in Newport, R.I.

More than 50 people interested in liturgical music--choral, organ, and guitar--have pre-registered for the workshop, to be conducted by the World Library of Sacred Music in conjunction with The Christian Life Center at the women's college.

The public is invited to register for the full five-day session, at a cost of \$40, or for any single day, at a cost of \$9.50. Campus housing on the American plan will also be available, both during the Workshop and on the weekend thereafter. Reservations may be made by calling the College's Residence Office at 847-6650.

At the workshop, a seven-man faculty from the World Library, along with their students, will explore the varied approaches to the celebration of the Liturgy. In addition to choral, organ, and guitar music, there will be sessions on electronic music, and sacred dance; panel discussions; and daily Mass.

Problem solving, group discussion, and performance will highlight each day's schedule which will begin at 9 a. m., and end in the early evening.

An extensive selection of European and American choral, organ, piano, and instrumental music will be on exhibit for Workshop participants. Practice rooms will be open, and secular as well as sacred sheet music will be on display.
