NURSING DEPARTMENT ACCREDITATION VISIT

The Department of Nursing will be visited by representatives of the National League for Nursing, the accrediting body, from October 12 to 15, 1976. The "team" will be composed of Dr. Mary Dineen of Boston College and Dr. Jacqueline Hott of Adelphi College. These representatives will meet with administration, nursing faculty and nursing students in order to discuss the present program, ascertain how it is conducted and how it would be evaluated by the various people with whom they talk. They will also visit the Library, the hospitals and other clinical agencies where the students receive their training.

The Department has prepared a Self-Evaluation Report for accreditation purposes and this report deals with administration, faculty, students and curriculum and resources (Library, Audio-Visual and Agencies). The team members will make a report at the end of their visit which will be read to the nursing faculty and then sent to the N. L. N. in New York. Both reports along with supporting data will be reviewed by a committee of the N. L. N. and the continuing accreditation of the Department will be decided at a formal meeting in December, 1976.

Nursing students who wish to read the Self-Evaluation Report may do so through the kindness of Sister Mary Giles Peresich, Librarian, who has placed a copy on reserve in the Library. Other copies may be inspected in the Office of the Department of Nursing in O'Hare, Room 217.

Internship Program

Chairman, Senator Robert J. McKenna D-District 50 of Newport, on behalf of the Commission on State Government Internships announces that approximately 60 internships will be available during the Spring Semester. Students are placed with executive, administrative, legislative and judicial agencies of State Government for a period of approximately 12 weeks, working a minimum of eight to ten hours with the host agency. In addition, an integrating seminar is conducted each Monday afternoon under the direction of Dr. Victor L. Profughi, Chairman of the Academic Advisory Committee and Honorable Oliver L. Thompson, Jr., Program Administrator.

A stipend of \$100 to assist with expenses is provided and most cooperating colleges and universities provide academic credit through an appropriate internal mechanism, usually independent study. Further information and application forms may be secured from the Office of College and Community Relations, 3rd Floor, Ochre Court. The deadline date for applications is December 3, 1976.
