### ADVENT LITURGY CAPTURES EXPECTANT HOPE OF THE SEASON

The characterization of all Advent prayer is that of waiting. Advent is a liturgy of hope for a waiting world. The opening liturgical prayer for the first Sunday of Advent is:

Our hearts desire the warmth  
of your love and our minds are  
searching for the light of your  
words.

Liturgy celebrated daily on campus is an opportunity for faculty, students and staff to witness to one another as an Advent community who wait expectantly for the future that is to be while living joyfully with the present that already is.

Daily Liturgy is celebrated in the college chapel in Ochre Court at 7:00 a.m., Monday, Wednesday and Friday; and 12:00 noon on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday; and at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

### THE ELEPHANT ROARS AT THE MOUSE

The Newport City Council voted unanimously on November 24 to deny the SRC request for a Club license to serve wine and beer in the Boathouse. Jeremiah Lynch, Nina Donahue and Charles Cooke represented the college at the City Council meeting.

Under the direction of the Office of the Dean of Students, a separate corporation had been formed and was intended to be self-supporting. A license to serve wine and beer in the Boathouse was requested by the corporation. Persons served would have to be Club members and membership was limited to the SRC community.

Neighbors' feelings ran high and out of proportion to the request. The town fathers listened to the objections that ranged from zoning ordinance violations, to possible detriment to historic property to unfair competition to downtown restaurants.

The request for the limited liquor license to be restricted to the Boathouse with its capacity of 81 persons was crushed by the alleged potential to ruin the neighborhood and, indeed, the economic life of the City of Newport. All that remains to be said is to remind us all, "If at first you don't succeed. . ." Courage, all!

### CHRISTMAS IN NEWPORT AT SALVE

On December 6, 8, 11, 1976 Salve Regina College will again be an active participant in "Christmas In Newport." The Newport College Singers will perform at Ochre Court on Monday, December 6 at 8:00 p.m. The two-part program will open with the English Contemporary composers, Benjamin Britten's "A Ceremony of Carols." This is a musical setting of 15th century carols for women's chorus and harp. Joyce Carlson will be the guest harpist.

The second part of the Newport College Singers production will be traditional Carols from around the world followed by Wassail. Mr. Glenn Giuttari is the director and conductor of the performance.

In preparation for the "Christmas In Newport" Concert, the Newport Singers will be on tour on Saturday and Sunday, December 4th and 5th. The Singers will be at St. Joseph Church, Lynn, Mass., on Saturday and they will perform at St. Joseph's Church, Newport on Sunday where they will sing as part of the Vespers Service which begins at 6:00 p.m.

On Wednesday, December 8th at 8:00 p.m. in Ochre Court, The Bell Ringers of the First Presbyterian Church under the direction of Frank E. Converse will give a half hour Christmas concert. At 8:30 p.m., immediately following the Bell Ringers Concert, Sister Mary Giles and Mr. Robert Kulo will give an Oral Interpretation of Truman Capote's modern classic, "A Christmas Memory." This is an autobiographical tale of how Truman Capote and his Aunt prepared for Christmas when he was growing up in the South.

On Saturday, December 11th at 8:00 p.m. Carey Mansion will be the setting for an 18th century Christmas play.

## DIRECTORS WORKSHOP (ENG. 390) PRODUCTION "NO EXIT" BY JEAN-PAUL SARTRE

The Directors' Workshop production of Jean-Paul Sartre's "No Exit" will be held on Friday, December 3rd at 8:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall. Student Directors are John Laski and Claire Roediger. The cast is: Denise Foley McCarthy, Debbie Chandler, Doug Humphrey and John Laski.

In "No Exit," Existentialist Playwright and Philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre places three characters in a stuffy drawing room - his modern version of Hell. The people he places there are there because of their lack of authenticity, their proven inability to accept life affirmatively. In the course of the dramatic, gruesome revelations of the major characters, Garcin, Estelle and Inez, we, the audience, learn that they were spiritually dead before they physically died. The Directors provide a provocative evening of theatre and warmly invite you to share in the experience.

This production fulfills one of the requirements of Directing Workshop I (Eng. 390). Next semester, the English Department anticipates that students enrolled in both the Playwriting and Advanced Directing Workshops will provide a succession of student directed productions in the Mercy Hall facility.

An invitation has been received from John A. Knaun, Dean, Graduate School of Oceanography at University of Rhode Island. On Saturday and Sunday, the 11th and 12th of December, the marine community of the Narragansett Bay Campus of the University of Rhode Island is holding an open house in conjunction with the christening of the Graduate School of Oceanography's new deep sea research vessel, ENDEAVOR.

The new ship has been built with a four million dollar grant from the National Science Foundation and is a replacement for TRIDENT, a World War II former freighter which the University operated in support of deep sea research for fourteen years.
