LENTEN FORUM

The Sisters of Mercy of the Salve Community invite the total Salve Community to join them in solemnly ushering in the season of Lent by participating in a Solemn Vespers Service on Tuesday, February 22 at 4:45 p.m. in the College Chapel. Three Brothers of Jesus Crucified will act as the cantors.

The next day, Ash Wednesday, the first service of the Lenten Forum Series will officially open the Holy Season of Lent. Lenten Forum Flyers have been distributed throughout the campus. The Campus Ministry Office is sponsoring the Lenten Forum program and has scheduled one service per week. Fathers Healy and Hillman will offer the Liturgy at 7 P.M. on Ash Wednesday. Their talks during the Liturgy will point out the significance of the Lenten Season in our lives as Christians. On Thursday, March 3, Sister Paula Sharpe will offer a presentation aimed at developing a deeper realization of our Christian commitments. Her primary topic will be that of conversion and its relationship to this Lenten Season.

On Thursday, March 10, Sister Theresa Sparrow, R. S. M., Associate Director of Religious Education for the Diocese of Fall River, will give a presentation entitled "Earthen Vessels." Sister Theresa's presentation will combine slides and music. The musical selections will be by the St. Louis Jesuits.

On Thursday, March 17, Father Larry Toole will celebrate the Liturgy. This will be followed by a wine and cheese party.

On Thursday, March 24, Sister Marianne Postiglione, R. S. M., Director of the Media Center for the Diocese of Providence, will present a modern interpretation of the Way of the Cross followed by an open discussion. Sister will conclude with a slide presentation, entitled: "My People," a modern Good Friday meditation in song and music.

On Thursday, March 31, Reverend George Harrison will lecture on the new rite of penance. The lecture is intended to acquaint us with the meaning and procedure connected with the new rite of penance. The Lenten Forum series will conclude with this lecture which will be followed by a Eucharistic Celebration.

All Lenten Forum events will be held in Ochre Court and will begin at 7:00 P.M.

Dr. Anthony Walsh

During January, Dr. Anthony A. Walsh of the Department of Psychology, was visited by Dr. Alison Turtle of the University of Sydney, Australia. Dr. Turtle was in this country touring particular colleges and universities and consulting with certain scholars in regard to their research involvement in the history of psychology. Dr. Turtle's purpose in visiting

Salve was to discuss Dr. Walsh's research work in the history of phrenology and other areas. Dr. Turtle met with Sister Lucille, Salve's President and Dr. Megley, Academic Dean. One of her questions to them was concerned with how we all were able to work in such a lovely environment. She informed Dr. Walsh that of all the college campuses she had visited world-wide, ours was the most beautiful she had seen.

Recently two research articles published by Dr. Walsh appeared in print. One was in the TRANSACTIONS AND STUDIES OF THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS OF PHILADELPHIA based on an invited address given at the College by Dr. Walsh. The second article was published in the BULLETIN OF THE HISTORY OF MEDICINE, and was based on a paper delivered by Dr. Walsh at the 50th Anniversary Meeting of the American Association for the History of Medicine. Both of these items deal with the importance of phrenology to early medicine and neurology. A third article to be published this month in THE JOURNAL OF THE HISTORY OF THE BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES and is a critical essay on a newly published biographical source book on the history of psychology.

Most recently, Dr. Walsh has been invited to be a consultant again for the Professional Examination Service in New York. The service is responsible for creating and validating examinations used in the licensing of psychologists on the State level. Dr. Walsh participated in their program over a year ago and was invited to continue his involvement which focuses on his writing specialized questions for use on these licensing exams.

IN SEARCH OF THE GRAIL

Twenty Salve students headed by Dr. and Mrs. Hersh and Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Giuttari, took up the age-old quest for the Holy Grail during the January Interim. The adventure led them through England and Wales, visiting such famous sites as Stonehenge, Salisbury, Glastonbury (the mystic Isle of Avalon), Cadbury or Camelot and Tintagel, the site of Merlin's Cave and the birthplace of King Arthur. Geoffrey Ashe, author and foremost authority on the King Arthur mythology, traveled and lectured for ten days of the travel-study tour. His presence alone felt Arthurian.

The final week of the tour was spent in Oxford and London where the students were exposed to a wide variety of interests. Hearing symphonies and attending a Shakespearean play in Stratford-On-the-Avon, visiting the British Museum, and simply being in contact with the local people of a different culture will become priceless memories. Without doubt, those who took this tour will speak of this quest with fondness for the rest of their lives.

Thanks to the superb organization by Dr. Hersh, Glenn Giuttari and Joseph Monahan, the representative for "Humanities in Britain," the trip was a grand success. Who said the Grail can't be found?

D. I. E. T. Workshop

Last semester as a pilot study, the College Health Services sponsored a D. I. E. T. Workshop. A second twelve-week D. I. E. T. Workshop will begin on Monday, February 21. This workshop is designed to help those individuals, who wish to lose weight establish new eating behaviors. Studies have shown that permanent weight control requires an entirely different focus. It is one's daily eating and exercise habits, the input and output of energy that needs to be changed if one hopes to keep the weight off. Through the use of behavior modification techniques and sensible eating habits, this workshop will provide individuals with tools for effecting permanent weight control. The workshop is open to the entire College community and will be conducted by Eileen Malone, R. N., B. S. Besides Eileen's weekly presentations, guest lecturers are also scheduled. The "Do I Eat Thoughtfully Workshop" will begin Monday, February 21, 1977 and will run for twelve (12) consecutive weeks from 8 P. M. to 10 P. M.
