A noted writer, lecturer, and communications specialist will speak on "Communicating With Youth" in a special lecture Friday evening (Nov. 20) at Salve Regina College.

He is Dr. Robert F. Delaney, former director of the Edward R. Murrow Center of Public Diplomacy at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, and now president of the Thunderbird Graduate School of International Management, Phoenix, Ariz.

Dr. Delaney's lecture, will begin at 8 p.m. in the Twombly-Burden Room of the College's O'Hare Academic Center, Ochre Point Ave. The public is invited to attend; admission, free.

Similar addresses by Dr. Delaney on communications with the young have been highlights of two recent U.S. Navy public affairs seminars: a national meeting in the late summer in the Washington, D.C. area, and a First Naval District meeting last month in Boston. Dr. Delaney holds the rank of Captain in the Naval Reserve.

After successfully completing assignments with the Diplomatic Corps in Rome, Vienna, and Budapest early in his career, Dr. Delaney served as chief of the East European Branch of Voice of America. He was later assistant director of the Joint U.S. Public Affairs Office in Vietnam.

Immediately prior to his two-year Tufts appointment, he was assistant director of the United States Information Agency. He began his present duties at Thunderbird this year.

A New Englander, Dr. Delaney received his early education from the Sisters of Mercy of the Union, who conduct Salve Regina College. He subsequently earned baccalaureate degrees at the College of the Holy Cross, Worcester, Mass., and Catholic University, Washington, D.C.; a master of arts degree at Boston University; and a doctor of philosophy degree at Catholic University. He pursued his post-doctoral studies at the University of Vienna.

Editor of This Is Communist Hungary and co-editor of American Public Diplomacy, Dr. Delaney is the author of Your Future In the Foreign Service and The Literature of Communism in America. He has also written articles for anthologies and professional journals.
