# CONSORTIUM ON CONTINUING EDUCATION IN SOCIAL WELFARE

On Tuesday, March 15, the College will host an all day Workshop on "Child Abuse and Neglect," The Workshop will open with an address by Dr. Peter Kosseff, Ph.D., Director of the Adolescent and Children's Services Program of the Newport County Community Mental Health Center. During the remainder of the morning and afternoon, the following workshops will run concurrently; all participants will be able to attend two workshops.

- 1. Understanding the Law; Recognizing Child Abuse and neglect; Initial intervention.
- 2. Working with Parents.
- 3. Community Coordination of Child Abuse and Neglect Activities.

Katharine Ostrander, ACSW, Associate Professor of Social Work, Salve Regina College, is coordinator for this program which is made possible by a Federal Training Grant from the Office of Child Development, H. E. W., administered by the Rhode Island Department of Social and Rehabilitative Services, and executed by the Rhode Island Consortium for Continuing Education in Social Welfare of which Salve Regina College is a member.

## FILM LECTURE

Mr. William Richardson, founder of "Appalshop", a film workshop in Whitesburg, Kentucky, will give a lecture on film making on Friday, March II at II:30 a.m. Mr. Richardson's presentation will consist of the showing of a short film which he made; a discussion will follow as well as a question and answer period.

The first of a series of programs entitled "Education Via Radio" will be aired over WADK on Tuesday, March 22, 1977 from 9:05 - 10:00 a.m. The series is being sponsored by the Gerontology Committee as a service to the Community. The first five dates and the discussion topics for each have been chosen.

The first two hours will be used as an Introduction to the Series and will be informational rather than instructional. Members of the Administration will give an overall picture of the College's academic programs, future development and the services Salve Regina, the Newport College offers to the community.
