The first order of business of the newly formed group was to elect officers. The officers, the committee, and Mr. Kulo are presently canvassing local radio stations and other outlets for the needed materials to set up SRC's broadcast center. As a short range goal, "SRC COMMUNICATIONS" aims to be on the air, campus wide, the beginning of next semester. As a long range goal, the group hopes to expand their broadcasting by recording events and programs for airing on other stations.

Sister Mary Giles Peresich, Librarian and Sister M. Mauricita Stapleton, Assistant Librarian attended a meeting sponsored by the Special Libraries Association, Boston Chapter, which was held at Harvard Law School on Tuesday, March 15, 1977.

Sister Mary Giles found the afternoon most informative. The general topic was: "The New Copyright Revision, - How it affects the Librarian, the Publisher and the Law." There were three speakers: Mr. Morris Cohan, Librarian Harvard Law School, who gave a most interesting historical summary of "The History and Use of Copyright Law." Ms. Raya Dreben, a member of Palmer and Dodge Law Firm of Boston, who specializes in copyright law, addressed the group on "The New Copyright Law" which will go into effect next January 1, 1978. The third speaker was Mr. Charles Butts of Houghton and Mifflin publishers, who explained "How the New Copyright Law Will Protect Publishers and Authors." Both Sister Giles and Sister Mauricita found the meeting extremely helpful, and will be delighted to discuss the implications of the new Copyright law with anyone who may be interested.

Sister Mary Giles and Sister M. Mauricita are scheduled to attend another librarians' meeting, a one-day conference, at Massachusetts Institute of Technology on April 1. It is being sponsored by the Association of College and Research Libraries - New England Chapter. The program will be a presentation and discussion on the use of "Microfilms in Libraries."
