The music of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart will be featured in a recital Friday (Nov. 6) evening at Salve Regina College, Newport.

The baroque violin and piano program will take place in the Great Hall of Ochre Court on the Ochre Point Ave. campus, beginning at 8 p. m. The public is invited to attend. Students will be admitted free. The donation for adults will be one dollar.

Baroque violinist Sarah Sumner, and pianist Mary Sadovnikoff will present a program from the great Austrian composer's sonatas and rondos.

Mrs. Sumner, a Radcliffe College graduate and Fullbright scholar, studied composition at Harvard, Tanglewood, and Paris. A performer as well as a composer, she has played in chamber groups in this country and in Europe.

Also a Radcliffe graduate, Mrs. Sadovnikoff has served as an associate scholar of the Radcliffe Institute, as a composer and as a pianist. She has given recitals at Carnegie Recital Hall, and Town Hall, New York City, and at the Gardner Museum, Boston.

Mrs. Sumner and Mrs. Sadovnikoff, who first performed together as students at Radcliffe, have presented recitals in the United States and abroad.

Their recital at Salve Regina will be co-sponsored by the creative arts department and the speaker's committee of the College's student congress.
