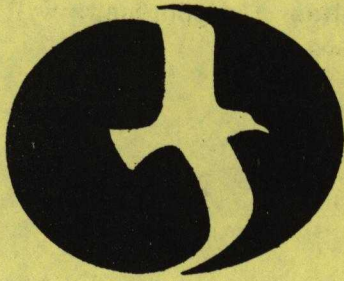

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

The Board of Trustees has designated three outstanding persons in the fields of education and public service to receive Honorary Degrees at the 27th Commencement on May 22, 1977. Sister Lucille made this announcement to the College Community at a faculty meeting on Friday, March 18, 1977. Full biographical information will be released to the public press at the appropriate time.

The Honorary Degree recipients are: The Honorable Florence K. Murray, Associate Judge of the Rhode Island Superior Court and member of the Salve Regina Advisory Board, which was the forerunner to the present Board of Trustees.

Mr. Charles D. O'Connell, Vice President of the University of Chicago and Dean of University Students. Mr. O'Connell, Vice Chairman of Salve Regina's present Board of Trustees, will be the Commencement Speaker.

The third recipient is Admiral Stansfield Turner, former President of the Naval War College and the recent appointee of President Carter as Director of the Central Intelligence Agency.
