PRESS RELEASE

The Faculty Senate of Salve Regina College is seriously concerned with the proper direction of the future of our College. Superficial press coverage in the Newport paper has created misunderstanding and unnecessary frictions.

No student-faculty strike has been planned despite news reports to the contrary. The Faculty Senate does not seek to disrupt but rather to assist our College to solve matters of grave common concern.

The members of the Salve Faculty share the concern of the Board of Trustees over Salve's decreasing enrollment. We desire to find both the cause and the cure of this problem and ^{possible} ~~the growing~~ financial problems at Salve Regina.

The Faculty Senate is seeking to provide a necessary forum for the presentation and discussion of issues vital to our college community. A dialogue has been sorely absent. Meaningful communication between all levels of the College Administration and other segments of the college community must be reestablished.

Our personal commitment to the future of Salve Regina has motivated us to discussion not disruption. The Faculty Senate will commence its efforts for a dialogue on Monday, November 23, 1970, through a day dedicated to "The Idea and Future of the Catholic College." This program will take place without disruption of scheduled classes or student activities.
