Salve Regina College will be offering law enforcement and general education courses at ten different locations around the State this semester, according to C. Edward O'Loughlin, dean of the College's Division of Continuing Education.

The college credit courses, open to the interested public as well as law enforcement agents, will be offered in Barrington, Cranston, Cumberland, East Providence, Lincoln, Pawtucket, Providence, Warren, and Warwick, as well as on Salve Regina's Cliff Walk campus in Newport.

During the spring semester, which begins the week of February 1, there will be a variety of courses in art, education, English, history, law enforcement, natural science, political science, psychology, and sociology. The courses will be conducted days, late afternoon, evenings, or Saturdays, for the convenience of policemen, housewives, and other adults whose work schedules may vary with the norm. Classes will meet with their instructor, usually once a week for three academic hours.

In announcing the "branch campus" offerings, Dean O'Loughlin said, "This greatly expanded community center concept has become a reality through the College's Law Enforcement Degree Programs. Now we can offer not only law enforcement personnel, but also the public at large, the opportunity to take college credit courses virtually anywhere in the state."
