Some 100 credit-courses in seventeen different disciplines will be offered this spring by Salve Regina College's Division of Continuing Education, according to Dean C. Edward O'Loughlin.

The division, which enrolled more than 1,000 Rhode Islanders in fall courses, will begin its spring term Monday, Feb. 1, with course offerings in Warwick, Cranston, and Cumberland, as well as on the College's Cliff Walk campus in Newport.

Registration for the 15-week semester will begin January 4, and end January 29. Mail registrations are encouraged, but in-person registration and academic counseling will be available January 20-27, at the Registrar's office from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Complete information on registration, course offerings, and fees may be obtained from the College's Division of Continuing Education administrative office (847-6650, Ext. 62/63).

The daytime, late afternoon, and evening offerings include courses on the introductory, intermediate, and/or advanced levels in art, music, theatre, biology, education, special education, English, French, history, law enforcement, mathematics, philosophy, political science, psychology, religious studies, social studies, sociology, and Spanish.

A fully accredited four-year College, Salve Regina, through its Division of Continuing Education, provides diverse educational opportunities for the Rhode Island community. Students with a high school education or its equivalent will be admitted without examination to any course for which they are qualified. Courses, taught by faculty members from several educational institutions including Salve Regina, are coeducational and interdisciplinary in approach, as well as small in size.
