Rev. Charles Breault, Natick, Mass., has joined the faculty of Salve Regina College, Newport, R.I., as an assistant professor of philosophy.

A native of South Attleboro, Mass. and a graduate of Oblate College and Seminary, Natick, Father Breault earned his Licentiate in Philosophy from Ottawa University, Canada, and his Doctor of Philosophy from Louvain University, France.

Prior to his current appointment, he had served on the faculties of St. Stevens College, Dover, Mass., and Oblate College and Seminary.

Father Breault holds membership in the American Catholic Philosophy Association, and is currently serving as chairman of the Provincial Advisory Board for the Oblates of Mary Immaculate.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Breault, Farnum Pike, Smithfield, R.I.
