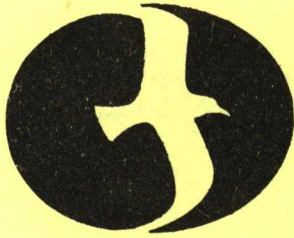

Well over a hundred members of the College Community gathered in the State Dining Room last Thursday evening April 20 to express their appreciation to Mrs. Katherine O'Connell. Mrs. O'Connell is retiring after 31 years of dedicated service to the College.

Just before partaking of the lovely buffet Sister Mary Philemon Banigan, Toast Mistress for the occasion, introduced Sister Lucille McKillop who in the name of past and present members of the College Community read the following citation:

"Katherine O'Connell, like a tender mid-wife, present and attentive at the birth of this College, you were among that band of valiant women who brought warmth and kindness to the years of our youth, growing with us in wisdom, age and grace.

Like the devoted mother of the family, no task was ever too trivial because you took pride in this College and you loved the students, teachers and fellow-workers as your own.

You have easily earned our respect from the very beginning; you have inspired our admiration through years of quiet, unstinting service. You have won our hearts and our gratitude for the days unending.

BOOKSTORE UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT

The administration is pleased to announce to the entire college community that, on or about June 1, the operation of the Bookstore will be taken over by College Service Corporation. This firm, headed by Edward J. Brennan, Jr., operates bookstores on twenty-six other college campuses. Included are: Amherst, Canisius, Manhattan, Mount Holyoke, Smith, Stonehill, Swarthmore, Wellesley and Wheaton.

As a first step in their take-over, College Service Corporation will hold a USED BOOK BUY in O'Hare Academic Center on Monday, May 15 and Tuesday, May 16. You may wish to dispose of your used texts for CASH.

Orders for Fall Semester texts, which have been received, have already been turned over to C.S.C. All others should be forwarded, through Dennis Hill, no later than May 10.

Orders for Intersession texts have been placed. These books will be distributed through the college.

As quickly as orders are received for Summer Session, they will be placed with the various publishers. Again, these books will be distributed by the college.

STUDENT CONGRESS DISSOLVES ITSELF

On April 22, 1978, the Student Congress of Salve Regina College dissolved itself. After year-long consideration, members of the Student Congress have designed and approved an alternative form of student government. This alternative form of student government consists of two separate but closely functioning student senates - the Student Life Senate and the Student Academic Senate. The Student Life Senate, comprised of the president and vice-president of each class, one representative from House Council, four members elected - at - large, and two commuter representatives, will provide a group of students specifically concerned with developing and coordinating

programs and events representing the social and cultural interests of the College Community and the large civic community. The Student Academic Senate, comprised of one student elected from each of the eighteen departments and programs, provides for a group of students specifically concerned with preserving the high quality of education at Salve Regina and promoting the academic development of the College Community.

Walk-through registration for the Fall Semester will be held in O'Hare Academic Center on the following dates:

May 8 - 12	Monday - Friday	9:00 - 11:00 a. m. 1:00 - 3:00 p. m.
May 11	Thursday	7:00 - 9:00 p. m.

Please note the following changes in the policies and procedures governing registration:

1. All students whether full or part time, matriculated or non-matriculated, must pay the \$25.00 non-refundable student service fee at the time of registration.

It is advised that all students make arrangements to have this money available on or before May 8 in order to register and obtain the courses desired. Students must first go to the Business Office and receive a receipt of payment prior to registering.

2. A \$5.00 fee for the drop/add procedure will be in effect for this and forthcoming registrations. Each course added to a previous registration will accrue a \$5.00 fee. Exceptions will be made only when a student has been notified of the closure or cancellation of a course in which he/she is registered.

Students must check with the Office of the Registrar regarding the availability of the new course to be added, pay the \$5.00 fee at the Business Office, and present the receipt obtained to the Academic Dean's Office for a course change to be made.

3. Since part-time students are not billed by the college, but rather are responsible for submitting full payment for courses prior to one week before the commencement of classes, students who have not completed all financial obligations to the college by that date will be automatically withdrawn from all classes. The student service fee collected upon registration will not be refunded to the student. The registration procedure is not complete until all financial obligations have been met. The college, therefore, reserves the right to refrain from providing any further services (including the issuing of transcripts) to students who have outstanding financial obligations to the college.
