#### TWENTY-EIGHTH COMMENCEMENT WEEK

The first event of the twenty-eighth commencement week was held last night, the Senior Class Dinner at Harry's Harborfront Club. The Commencement Ball will be on Friday, May 19, in Ochre Court. It will start with cocktails at 7 p.m., dinner at 8 p.m. and the Ball will begin at 9 p.m. The graduates, their dates and parents will be dancing to the music of Sea Journey. This year for the first time the Commencement Ball is being jointly sponsored by the Senior Class and Parents Council.

The reception which follows the Baccalaur eate Mass on Saturday will be hosted by the Alumni Association.

At the twenty-eighth commencement, Sunday, May 21, I978 over three hundred graduates will be awarded degrees. Twenty-one students will be awarded Master of Arts Degrees, one student will be awarded a Master of Science Degree. Three students will be awarded Bachelor of Arts and Science Degrees. Bachelor of Arts Degree recipients will number 46, while there will be 178 Bachelor of Science Degrees and 55 Associate of Science Degrees awarded.

Vice Admiral James Bond Stockdale will be the commencement speaker and will receive an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters, honoris causa, from The Newport College - Salve Regina. Admiral Stockdale has been President of the Naval War College since October 1977. Vice Admiral Stockdale graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1946; he also attended Monmouth College, West Long Beach, New Jersey and has a M. A. from Stanford University, California. During his second combat tour in Vietnam, where he was an aircraft squadron commander and air wing commander, he was shot down and captured, spending most of his seven and one half years of imprisonment in solitary confinement. He suffered repeated torture, yet organized the prisoners into united resistance. In addition to the Congressional Medal of Honor, the American Academy of Achievement, Mensa, Vice Admiral Stockdale holds twenty-four personal combat decorations.

The first Master of Science Degree in Criminal Justice to be awarded by the College will be received by Betty Lee Hanawalt of Middletown, Rhode Island. John and Barbara Kane, father and daughter, will each receive a Bachelor's Degree at the Commencement. The Kanes are residents of Newport.

The entire College Community wishes to take this opportunity to extend Congratulations to all the graduates and to wish each one success and happiness. We trust that you have been helped to become your best selves. We trust that you have used the opportunity to learn about academic excellence, about intellectual and moral integrity and have experienced a truly Christian Community. The administrators, faculty and staff of the Newport College - Salve Regina bid each graduate of the Class of 1978 farewell. We hope that our gift to each graduate has been the living realization of the College's Mission and Objectives:

The mission of the College is to lead students to truth in all disciplines. To develop the art of critical thinking, to refine, to clarify and to deepen this art within the context of Catholic values is the aim of the curriculum. To express this art in service and understanding or responsible stewardship of the world's resources is the mission of the college.

Your Alma Mater will follow with interest your careers and we all hope to see many members of the Class of 1978 return frequently to Alumni and College affairs.

#### ASSOCIATION OF CATHOLIC COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

The name of the College and University Department of the National Catholic Educational Association has been changed to Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities. The effective date of this change was May 1, 1978. Monsignor John F. Murphy, Executive Director, said that they were returning to their "roots" since Catholic colleges and universities first joined in membership in 1899 as the Association of Catholic Colleges. Only later, with the founding of the Catholic Educational Association in 1904, was the name changed to be a Department of Colleges and Universities and in 1927 to the name National Catholic Educational Association.

Sister Lucille McKillop is a member of the executive board of the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities. This change in name will not change the relationship with other departments of the "federation" which is the National Catholic Educational Association.

<u>Dr. Robert McKenna</u> attended the Harvard/ECS Conference "Partners or Rivals," May 14 - 16 at the Harvard Graduate School ofEducation.

Dr. McKenna was a reactor on a panel on Monday afternoon at the Harvard/ECS Conference. On Tuesday morning, at the request of the directors of the conference, Dr. McKenna chaired a special panel of State Legislators in which they gave their reactions both to the issues raised at the conference and their general experience in issues relating to higher education and State Legislatures. This panel had five legislators who questioned a panel of four experts and proved to be the most interesting and challenging part of the three day conference.

<u>Dr. Daniel McGregor</u> has recently conducted research on the topic of advocacy in Special Education.
