Attention all student employees both on and off campus. In order to maintain good service to our growing number of student employees, the Financial Aid and Business Offices hereby announce the following change in the student pay schedule for 1978-79 EFFECTIVE THIS WEEK:

- 1. Student time sheets for the <u>one-week</u> period 10/22-10/28 are due in the <u>Financial Aid Office</u> by noon this Friday, October 27. Pay day will also be this Friday, October 27 for the two-week period 10/15-10/21. Pay day for the one-week period 10/22-10/28 will be Friday, November 3.
- 2. Thereafter, the student pay schedule will be back to two-week intervals as follows:
