Sister Prudence Croke, Assistant Professor of Religious Studies, participated in the Second Conference on the Ordination of Women held in Baltimore, MD, November 10-12, 1978. The theme of the conference was "New Women, New Church, New Priesthood." Conference participants seek participation and recognition of women at every level of church activity including full participation in the sacramental rites of the Church. They work for the ordination of those qualified women who do priestly ministry, have been properly educated, and have been called forth by God and by the people whom they serve.
