THEOLOGY DEPARTMENT CHAIRMAN NAMED AT SALVE REGINA COLLEGE

A new chairman of the theology department at Salve Regina College, Newport, R. I., has been announced by Sister Mary Christopher, R.S.M., college president. He is Frank D. Maguire, Ph.D., former associate professor in the department of religion, Newton College of the Sacred Heart, Newton, Mass.

Graduated from Loyola of Montreal, Quebec, Dr. Maguire received his Master's degree in philosophy and theology from the University of Montreal, Quebec in 1961.

He studied patristics at Oxford University and the University of Paris, following completion of his graduate work, and in 1970 received his doctorate from the University of Montreal.

Before joining the staff at Newton College of the Sacred Heart, Dr. Maguire served as instructor at St. Joseph's Teachers College, Montreal and lecturer in Christian ethics in the philosophy department, Loyola of Montreal.
