John S. Renza, vice president for financial affairs at Salve Regina College, Newport, since 1967 joins the Cranston School Department on Wednesday, December 1, 1971.

Mr. Renza, a Cranston resident, assumes the position of business administrator for Cranston schools. His resignation from the administrative staff at Salve Regina and his acceptance of the new position was announced at a Cranston school committee meeting in October. He has continued to serve at the College through November 30, 1971.

Sister Mary Christopher, R.S.M., president of Salve Regina, in a memorandum to members of the administration and administrative staff said, "It is with sincere regret that I announce the resignation of Mr. John S. Renza, vice president for Financial Affairs."

"He leaves Salve to join the Cranston School System and will assume his new position, business administrator, after December 1."

"I wish to express my appreciation for Mr. Renza's cooperation and contribution to our administrative efforts in a time that has been very trying, particularly in the area in which he has been involved."

The Board of Trustees and Sister Mary Christopher are currently in the process of recruiting a replacement for Mr. Renza.
