SALVE'S EDUCATION VIA RADIO

On Tuesday, November 13, 1979 the College is resuming its Education via Radio Programs for the 1979-80 academic year. They will be broadcast over WADK from 9:05 - 10:00 a.m. on every other Tuesday morning.

The Religious Studies Department will start the series with three broadcasts. The general topic which the Religious Studies faculty members have chosen is: "Religion: Cognitive verses Affective Approaches."

One of the recurring questions that arises in the discussions of the topic of Religion is whether within a greater or lesser faith-context the particular approach ought to be cognitive or affective. That is to say, whether the approach shall be either an intellectual or emotional one. During the next three weeks the apparent tension between these two approaches will be explored.

On Tuesday, November 13, the topic will be: "Christianity: The Head vs. the Heart." Sister Prudence Croke, Ph.D., and Frank D. Maguire, Ph.D. will be the panelists.

On Tuesday, November 27 the topic will be: "The Western and the Eastern Religions." Lubomir Gleiman, Ph.D. and James Hersh, Ph.D. will be the panelists.
