FACULTY APPOINTMENT ANNOUNCED

Brother John J. Greeley, F.S.C., has been appointed Associate Professor of Religious Studies and Assistant Chairman of the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies.

Brother John, a distinguished scholar, teacher, and missionary is a Phi Beta Kappa, Magna Cum Laude graduate of The Catholic University of America, where he was awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree in Classics. He earned both Licentiate in Sacred Theology and Doctor of Sacred Theology degrees from the same institution. In addition, he holds a Master of Arts degree in Classics from Manhattan College.

He has held teaching appointments both in this country and abroad, including appointments at De LaSalle College and Manhattan College where he served as an Assistant Professor of Religious Studies.

As Assistant Chairman of the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies, Brother John will give special attention to the curriculum and instructional development in Religious Studies.

SCIENCE DEPARTMENT REORGANIZED

Sister Lucille McKillop, President of The Newport College -Salve Regina, has announced the appointment of Dr. Mary Louise Ide to head the newly formed Department of Biology and Health Sciences. In order to better administer the Department of Science at the College, it has been reorganized into the Department of Biology and Health Sciences and the Department of Physics and Chemistry, which will continue to be chaired by Dr. Ascanio DiPippo.

As chairman of the Department of Biology and Health Sciences, Dr. Ide will give special attention to curriculum and instruction and the expansion of student services. Prior to joining the faculty at The Newport College, she taught at the University of Florida from 1974 - 1979 in the University's College of Medicine and the College of Arts and Sciences. Dr. Ide received her Ph.D. in Biochemistry from the College of Medicine of the University of Florida, her Master of Arts in Biology from Rhode Island College, and her Bachelor of Science degree in Medical Technology from Southeastern Massachusetts University.

COLLEGE RECEIVES A SEARS ROEBUCK FOUNDATION GRANT

Mr. John Pelletier, Manager of the Sears Middletown store, presented Sister Lucille McKillop with a grant check from the Sears Roebuck Foundation.

Grants totaling more than \$12,400 will be distributed to eight privately supported colleges and universities in Rhode Island this week by The Sears-Roebuck Foundation.

The Rhode Island colleges and universities are among over 1,000 private accredited two and four year institutions across the country which are sharing in \$1,500,000 in Sears Foundation funds for the 1979-80 academic year. Funds may be used unrestrictedly as the colleges and universities deem necessary.

In addition to its unrestricted grant program, The Sears-Roebuck Foundation each year conducts a variety of specialpurpose programs in elementary, secondary, higher, and continuing education. Altogether, the Foundation had expenditures of almost \$2,500,000 in 1979 for its education activities.

The parking area at the west end of O'Hare Academic Center is reserved for Handicap Parking, unauthorized vehicles will be tagged and towed.
