EDUCATION VIA RADIO

The Newport College - Salve Regina's Education Via Radio will continue on WADK on Mondays from 9:05 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. beginning January 28. Brother Victor Hickey, Chairman of the Department of Education, has organized a series of programs on innovations in curriculum and modes of education in the 80's.

The first program will include four panelists. Dr. Robert J. McKenna, Associate Professor of History and Politics, will discuss University and College Education. Mr. Philip E. Coen, Superintendent of Middletown Schools, and Dr. Vincent Trainor, Jr., Superintendent of Newport Public Schools, will address public education at the secondary and elementary levels. Rev. John Farley, Vicar for Education, will speak on independent education at the elementary and secondary levels. The panel will focus on student population, use of facilities, development of curriculum, financing and the resulting quality of education as they see it in the 1980's.

The second program which is to be aired on February 11 will focus on innovations in education in the 80's. Specific areas to be discussed are career education, traditional vs. nonformal education, the use of community resources in education, and the return to basics.

The panel for the second program consists of Brother Victor Hickey, Chairman of the Department of Education, Mr. Paul Rochford, Principal of Middletown High School and part-time instructor in Education at the College, and Mr. Thomas Sweeney, Director of Vocational and Curriculum Development for Portsmouth Public Schools.

The third program will be a further development of topics generated by the first two programs.

PARKING REGULATIONS

All members of the faculty, staff, and student body shall be required to register their vehicle with the college security department to obtain a Salve Regina College parking decal. College security shall have authority to have towed, any vehicle not having proper Salve Regina College identification. Mutilated decals replaced on request.

The traffic pattern is "ONE WAY" within the area of Angelus, McAuley Hall and O'Hare Academic Center. Traffic to the academic area may enter at the west end of Marion Hall and exit at the south end of the Gatehouse onto Ochre Point Avenue. DO NOT enter area via entrance at Gatehouse.

The parking area at Angelus and Marion Hall is reserved for resident students of McAuley Hall. Faculty members with offices in Angelus Hall are authorized to park on Leroy Avenue parallel to the brick wall ONLY.

The parking area at the west end of O'Hare Academic Center is reserved for Handicap Parking, unauthorized vehicles will be tagged and towed.

ATTENTION STUDENTS

All students are reminded that "Diagonal Parking" is not authorized on the streets adjacent to the campus, (Ochre Point Ave., Shepard Ave. and Leory Ave.). Vehicles found in violation of "Parallel Parking" will be ticketed by the Newport Police Department.

Any vehicle blocking the street to prevent the passage of Emergency Equipment will be towed.
