COLLEGE PRESIDENT RECEIVES HONOR

Sister Lucille McKillop, President of The Newport College - Salve Regina, was honored by the Military and Hospitaller Order of St. Lazarus of Jerusalem by being made a Companion of Merit in the rank of officer of the Order of St. Lazarus of Jerusalem.

Dr. Howard S. Browne, Marshal of the Grand Prior of America, presented the decoration to Sister Lucille on Tuesday, February 12, 1980. The Reverend Edward Kelly, College Chaplain, read the investiture prayer and blessed the decoration which Dr. Browne presented to Sister Lucille, The honor was bestowed on Sister Lucille for her outstanding assistance to the Commandery of the Atlantic on the occasion of its seminar on Biomedical Ethics in regard to Ageing held at the College in June of 1978.

The Order is international, and now ecumenical. The administrative head-quarters are on Malta; the Grand Master, or head of the Order, is a Spanish Bourbon, Don Francisco Enrique de Borbon y Borbon, uncle of the King of Spain. The Grand Prior, or head of the Order in America, is Dr. Hans von Leden of Los Angeles, noted otolaryngologist.

The Order still exists to carry out its historic mission to support the care of lepers, but has added to its list of charitable activities the care of the aged, relief in time of war and natural disasters, relief of Christians in Iron Curtain countries, and promotion of Christian unity.
