FIVE STUDENTS WILL ATTEND WASHINGTON INTERNSHIP

Five students have been chosen to attend the Washington Internship Program from March 3-7, 1980. They are Nancy FitzPatrick, a senior majoring in Management; Mark Gordon, a junior majoring in Political Science; Joyce Kubinec, a senior majoring in Political Science; Ann Frances O'Malley, a senior majoring in International Studies and Spanish; and Laurie Jean Schremser, a senior majoring in Political Science and Criminal Justice. Three will be in the office of Senator Pell and two in the office of Congressman Beard.

This will be the 20th consecutive year that the students of The Newport College - Salve Regina will be attending an Internship Program in Washington, DC. This program was initiated in 1961 by the then freshman U.S. Senator Claiborne Pell. Since that time Representative Edward P. Beard has instituted an internship, and Senator John Chafee also has begun his own Internship Program which runs during the summer months.

The Internship Program allows students to spend one week in the Washington office of a United States Senator or Representative and to act as a temporary employee of the Member. They have an opportunity to observe committee meetings, see action on the floor of the House and Senate, and to attend sessions of the U.S. Supreme Court.

TO BE GRAND MARSHAL FOR PARADE
