FINANCIAL AID NEWS

Reminder: March 1, 1980 is the deadline for a complete financial aid file. The Financial Aid Office has been sending postcards every two weeks notifying students of which documents have been received and of which documents are still outstanding. If you have applied for financial aid and have not received one of these cards, or if you cannot complete your file by March 1, 1980, please contact the Financial Aid Office as soon as possible.

The Basic Grant Student Eligibility Report is in the process of being mailed to your home. This year's report does not look anything like the red-bordered, three-part carboned form used in 1979-1980. The 1980-81 SER is light green in color, measures 10½" x 11" and is carbonless. Please submit all three copies to the Financial Aid Office so that we may determine your award.

The Business and Professional Women's Club of Providence annually awards a \$300 scholarship to a female resident of Rhode Island entering her junior or senior year of college in September 1980. The award is based on scholastic record, financial need and personal background. Applications along with an academic transcript and one letter of recommendation should be sent to:

TOMORROW IS LEAP YEAR DAY

February 29 is a day added to the calendar once every four years. 1980, being bissextile or Leap Year, adds one day, February 29, to bring our Gregorian calendar more nearly into accord with the Earth's orbital period (365.2422 days). The intercalary adjustment is made every four years except century years which are not exactly divisible by 400. Leap Year adjustment was first made in 46 B.C. Next Leap Year will be 1984, although Leap Seconds may be added December 31

(as they have since 1972), June 30, or at other times specified by the Bureaux International de L'Heure. Traditionally Leap Year is a time during which women may propose marriage to men.

LENTEN LITURGY

In order to afford a greater opportunity for participation in the Liturgy during Lent, and at the request of some students, an additional Mass will be offered every Monday through Thursday in the Chapel at 3:45 p.m. Therefore, the Lenten Mass schedule for weekdays will be: 7 a.m., 12 noon, and 3:45 p.m. (except Friday).

We would also like to remind you that private confession is available every Wednesday after the noon Mass.

ATTENTION NURSING STUDENTS

The Nursing Department is seeking applications from those students who have already met the requirements of Steps 1 and 2 of the "Requirements for Admissions to the Nursing Department."

All such applications will be carefully considered and decisions made in time for spring pre-registration. Applicants interested in applying should so signify in writing prior to March 28, 1980. The written application should contain a specific rationale for requesting admission, and a letter of recommendation from a person not a member of the student's family should accompany the application.

The traffic pattern is "ONE WAY" within the Angelus, McAuley Hall and O'Hare Academic Center. Traffic to the academic area may enter at the west end of Marion Hall and exit at the south end of the Gatehouse onto Ochre Point Ave. **DO NOT ENTER** via the entrance at Gatehouse.

The parking area at Angelus and Marion Hall is reserved for resident students of McAuley Hall. Faculty members with offices located in Angelus Hall shall be authorized to park adjacent the brick wall, on Leroy Ave. between the walkway and the entrance to Cave Cliff. No parking between Ochre Point Ave. and the walkway to Ochre Court.
