The Financial Aid Office reminds applicants that if you have not submitted all the necessary documents for a complete financial aid file for 80-81, you must do so immediately or risk loss of funding for campus based funds.

A complete file consists of:

- Parents 1979 1040 or 1040A Form (or student's if Independent)
- SRC Financial Aid Application (green and blue)
- Verification of Non-taxable income (if applicable)
- FAF needs analysis report (from Princeton)
- BEOG Student Eligibility Report (when you receive it)

If you have not filed for financial aid, but wish to apply for a Basic Grant, you may do so at any time up to March 15, 1981.
