NEW APPOINTMENT

On April 1, 1980, Mr. Christopher M. Kiernan will be joining our staff in the position of Assistant to the President for the Development of Enrollment. In this position Mr. Kiernan will report directly to the President and provide administrative support for the development of the College's total enrollment through the 80's. Mr. Kiernan will participate in long range institutional planning and the development of institutional resources, in addition to developing and overseeing a comprehensive plan for recruitment in conjunction with intercollegiate athletics for both men and women.

Christopher Kiernan comes to us from St. Joseph's College, in North Windham, Maine, where he has recently been serving as Dean of Continuing Education. He has also held the positions of Dean of Student Affairs, Director of Admissions and Financial Aid, Director of Athletics, and Varsity Basketball Coach at St. Joseph's College. Mr. Kiernan has also served as Assistant Director of Admissions and Financial Aid at Assumption College in Worcester, Massachusetts, and has extensive experience as a member of various evaluation teams for the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.


