ALCOHOL TASK FORCE REPORT

Barbara King, M.S.W., director of the outpatient program of Edgehill-Newport Alcohol Treatment Center spoke to the Special Task Force on Alcohol Abuse on Wednesday, April 16. She discussed information that would be of use to the task force in its study of alcohol use in the College Community and in writing its recommendations. The task force is composed of students, faculty, staff and parents. They are divided into three subcommittees who will prepare reports to be given to the Steering Committee in June.

In her comments Ms. King recommended that the task force look to the needs not only of those who may have the disease of alcoholism but also to those who are affected by the problem in a close relation. Surveys indicate that one in every ten persons is so affected.
