STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIAL TO SPEAK

Until last year he was Counselor of Political Affairs in Tehran, Iran. Previous to that he had been Deputy Chief of Mission in Beirut and Political Officer in London. He has served a variety of Washington and overseas assignments including Israel, Republic of Guinea, Vietnam, Laos and Germany. He holds Master degrees in both International Studies and Diplomatic Law.
