ACCEPTS NEW POSITION

Sister Mary Marjorie Walsh has accepted the position of Director for Student Records at Salve Regina College. Sister Marjorie leaves the Office of Placement and Career Counseling after serving as its Director for 11 years. During those years she led Salve to its highest record in the expansion of on-campus recruitment, offering of credentials service, the conducting of workshops on resume writing and job interviews, coordination of the campus work-study program, the services re: Interest Inventory Tests and Graduate Record Examinations, and the evaluation of the progress of graduates.

In her new position, Sister Marjorie will use her organizational skills in updating all student and alumni records.

CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS GIVE SCHOLARSHIP

The Captain Louis Gallucci Scholarship was presented to the College July 21 by the R.I. Brotherhood of Correctional Officers (R.I.B.C.O.). The \$500 scholarship is given in memory of Captain Louis Gallucci, a 1973 graduate of the College, and former superior officer at the medium security section of the Adult Correctional Institute. The award was presented to Sister Lucille McKillop by Ronald Brodeur, R.I.B.C.O. vice-president. It will be given each year to a Newport College student majoring in Criminal Justice.

Captain Gallucci was an officer at the A.C.I. for 20 years. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from The Newport College. Prior to his death in 1979 he was active in establishing the College Incentive program for correctional officers. This program is designed to encourage corrections officials to further their education in law enforcement and criminal justice.

INSTITUTE ON THE CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Over 125 individuals are on The Newport College campus this week participating in the third annual Institute on the Christian Initiation of Adults.
