SISTER THERESE PROMOTED TO VICE PRESIDENCY

Sister M. Therese Antone has been named to the new position of vice president for institutional advancement by Sister Lucille McKillop.

Sister Therese has served as director of development since 1976, coordinating a comprehensive development program involving alumni, parents, corporations, foundations, government agencies and community leaders. She is a member of the President's Administrative Council and has served on the Board of Trustees since 1973. She is also an assistant professor of mathematics.

As vice president for institutional advancement, Sister Therese will be in charge of planning, coordinating and supervising College development, communications and public relations programs.

NAMED DEPARTMENT CHAIRPERSON

Sister Madeleine Gregoire, D.H.S. has been named to chair the Department of Mathematics and an Assistant Professor of Mathematics. Sister Madeleine had been Assistant Professor of Mathematics at Annhurst College which closed in June. She had also been Dean of Admissions at the College from 1965-67.

Sister earned her M.A. and Ph.D. from Catholic University of America. She was President of the College Assembly in 1977 and offered a methods workshop for the Pomfret Community School. She was involved in the establishment of a computer science program at Annhurst. She is a member of the Association for Computing Machinery and the American Mathematical Society.

LARGEST GROUP OF FULL-TIME FACULTY APPOINTED

The largest group of new full-time faculty ever appointed to the College met for orientation on Thursday, September 4. After being greeted by Sister Lucille McKillop, the group spent the morning learning of the various services offered by the College. Joan Chapdelaine

Joining the Nursing Department as an Instructor of Nursing is Mrs. Joan Chapdelaine. A graduate of Salve Regina, Joan earned her M.S. at Boston University. She has been Oncology Nursing Coordinator for the Rhode Island Cancer Control Program. Previously, she had been Director of Nursing at Truesdale Hospital in Fall River. She has also been Clinical Coordinator and Instructor of Nursing at Newport Hospital School of Nursing.

James C. Farrington

James C. Farrington, retired Deputy Assistant Director - Legal Counsel for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, will be Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice. As Deputy Director Dr. Farrington was responsible for administration and supervision of the agent attorneys of the F.B.I. Previously, he had organized and prepared guidelines related to the Freedom of Information Act and the Privacy Act.

A graduate of the University of New Hampshire, he earned his J.D. at Boston College. He is a member of the District of Columbia Bar admitted to practice before the Court of Appeals and the U.S. Supreme Court. He has lectured extensively at the F.B.I. National Academy.

Kathryn Flood

Kathryn Flood will be an Instructor of Special Education. She has a B.S. from the University of Cincinnati and a M.Ed. from Xavier University. She has been a Visiting Instructor at Miami University of Ohio and has taught in the Cincinnati Public Schools.

Gilbert Green

Joining the Management Department as an Assistant Professor of Management is Col. Gilbert Green, U.S.A. (Ret.). He earned a B.B.A. from Western Michigan University and an M.B.A. from American University. An outstanding graduate of the Naval War College his most recent assignment has been as an instructor at the War College. He has held a number of managerial positions in the Army.

Bernard Masterson

Bernard Masterson has been appointed Visiting Assistant Professor of Fine Arts. A graduate of Providence College with an M.A. from Brown University, Bernard served as Vice Principal of Fine Arts at Hope High School. He taught at La Salle Academy, Warren High School and the Providence Public School Department. He was Chairman of the English Department and Director of Theater at Classical High School. In 1970 Mr. Masterson founded the Young People's School for the Performing Arts, Inc. In ten years more than 800 students have attended the school. This fall one of the school's campuses will be The Newport College.

NEW OFFICE OF PUBLIC RELATIONS STAFFED BY
DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC RELATIONS AND
DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE INFORMATION

To meet the growing internal and external information needs of the College, the Office of Public Information has expanded. It is now the Office of Public Relations staffed by Susan Closter-Godoy, director of public relations & advertising, and Sister Esther Whalen, director of college information.

Susan Closter will be responsible for developing and maintaining a full public relations, advertising and promotion program for the College. In addition to preparing publications for development, alumni and student recruitment, Susan will be in charge of all news & feature writing, media relations and publicity. The new director of public relations & advertising will also prepare and place all College advertising, coordinate College photography, and assist with special events.

Sister Esther Whalen is now director of college information. She is responsible for coordinating and publishing all internal information about the College, including the weekly Newsbulletin, College directory, calendars, handbooks, semester schedules, the catalogues and Newport magazine. She will also maintain a current record of all College statistics, program information, and College mailing lists.

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC RELATIONS

Susan Closter-Godoy has been appointed to the new position of director of public relations & advertising at the College.

Prior to joining the College, Susan was administrator for the Newport Cultural Affairs Commission. She also served as marketing/public relations coordinator for the Cambridge, (Mass.) architecture/planning firm Wallace, Floyd, Ellenzweig, Moore.

Other communication posts held by Susan include assistant editor of pr reporter, the national newsletter for public relations practitioners, and public information specialist for the Naval Underwater Systems Center in Newport.

She holds a Bachelor of Arts from Newton College of the Sacred Heart, Newton, Mass. and a Master of Science in public relations from Boston University's School of Public Communication. She is a member of the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA) and the New England Chapter of PRSA.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Michael Chadwick of Peace Dale, R.I. has been named to the new position of assistant director of athletics. He will also serve as men's varsity basketball and baseball coach.

Chadwick was the University of Rhode Island baseball team captain in 1978. As varsity baseball coach, he will be in charge of training the first men's team to compete with area colleges in the spring of 1981.

"Expansion of The Newport College's athletic program with a new full-time assistant director of athletics and men's varsity baseball team moves the College one step closer to becoming active on an NCAA Division III level," indicates Paul Cardoza, director of athletics.

As assistant director of athletics, Chadwick will participate in developing and implementing the College's expanding athletic program. He holds a B.S. in Physical Education. He recently served as Intramural Director at the Navy Education Training Center.

PLANS CONFERENCE

Katharine Ostrander, A.S.C.W., Program Director of the Social Work Department is on the planning committee for the Social Work Practice in Sexist Society Conference to be held September 14 - 16 in Washington, D.C. The conference is the first national one sponsored by the National Committee on Women's Issues of the National Association of Social Workers. The Conference will provide an opportunity for social workers to reflect on the issues and challenges of practice with women and to share ideas for strengthening intervention with women.

The Honorable Joan Wallace, M.S.W., Assistant Secretary of Agriculture, will deliver the opening address, "Hearing Women: Making Policy Responsive in the 1980's."

AWARDED FULBRIGHT TRAVEL GRANT

Joyce Kubinec, Class of 1980, has been awarded a Fulbright Travel Grant for graduate study during the 1980-81 academic year. She was selected by the 12-member U.S. President appointed Board of Foreign Scholarships of the Institute of International Education in New York City.

Her award is a joint U.S. government and Polish government grant to study at the Institute of Law, University of Warsaw. She will investigate the effects of the 1939-45 German occupation of Poland on the international contracts of Marconi Wireless, Ltd., a Warsaw business firm. Joyce plans a career in international law.

Joyce is one of 320 American students selected this year. A Politics major Joyce was co-editor of the Regina Maris and a member of Sigma Phi Sigma.
