WELCOME

Administrators, faculty and staff welcome new and returning students to The Newport College - Salve Regina. We wish you a year of intellectual stimulation and personal growth in keeping with the mission of the College: "to lead students to truth in all disciplines ...The College aims at helping students with respect to their ultimate goals and dignity as persons and simultaneously with respect to the good of those societies in which, as members, they will participate and in whose responsibilities they will share."

This academic year marks the highest enrollment in the history of the College. Over 450 new students including the largest freshman class increase the enrollment to approximately 1800. The 278 freshmen represent 12 states and two foreign countries.

Again we welcome all new and returning students and urge you to use the opportunities available at Salve to become your best selves.

LARGEST GROUP OF FULL-TIME FACULTY APPOINTED

The largest group of new full-time faculty ever appointed to the College met for orientation on Thursday, September 4. After being greeted by Sister Lucille McKillop, the group spent the morning learning of the various services offered by the College. After luncheon the group focused their attention on the instructional supports offered by the College. In the Newsbulletin's September 11 issue, six new faculty members were introduced. This issue will introduce the remaining six new faculty.

Sister Elizabeth McAuliffe, R.S.M. is joining the department of Education as an instructor. A Salve graduate, Sister Elizabeth earned a M.S.T. from the University of New Hampshire. Sister was principal of Bishop Gerrard High School in Fall River from 1975-1980 and during the past several years has directed "We Agree" workshops, a program aimed at aiding educational institutions in setting goals.

Sister Theresa McQueeney, S.N.D. has been appointed assistant professor of French and English. A graduate of Emmanuel College, she received an M.A. from Assumption College and a Ph.D. from Georgetown University. She taught English as a Second Language at the following colleges and universities: Annhurst, Yale - Summer Program, N.D. Seishen, Okayama, Japan and St. Mary-of-the-Woods, and has conducted numerous workshops in language methodology. Sister Theresa is a member of the Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages, the American Translators Association, and the Paul Claudel Society.

Sister Leona Misto, R.S.M. is joining the department of Mathematics as an instructor. A Salve graduate, Sister has an M.A. from Rhode Island College and a M.R.S. from Providence College. Sister was the director of education for SS Peter and Paul Parish in Fall River and before that was director of spirituality for the Sisters of Mercy, Province of Providence. Sister Leona has taught at Bishop Feehan High School, St. Xavier Academy and St. Mary Academy, and she has served on the Executive Committee of the National Association of Parish Coordinators and Directors.

Mr. Paul Pacheco, formerly on the faculty at Rhode Island College, is joining the new Accounting department as an assistant professor. Mr. Pacheco has a B.S. from Bryant College and an M.B.A. from South-eastern Massachusetts University. He served as Financial Analyst for The Acushnet Company, Gulf Division, and Gulf and Western Manufacturing, and he is a member of the National Association of Accountants.

After several years as a part-time instructor, Ann Pelletier has joined the Modern Language Department as a full-time instructor in Spanish. A graduate of William and Mary College, she earned her M.A. at the University of Madrid. While in Spain she worked at the U.S. Information Agency, was a writer and announcer for National Radio, and taught English on National Television. She worked at St. Philomena School and taught English as a Second Language at Portsmouth Abbey. Among her publications is "Shopping in Spain" - Fodor's Modern Guide to Spain and Portugal.

Marjorie Roblin-Patterson, instructor of Sociology will be teaching Social Work courses this year. She earned a B.S. and M.A.T. at State University of New York and a M.S.S. at Bryn Mawr College. Besides a private practice, she has been employed as a social worker for the Justice Services Division of the Episcopal Community Services in Philadelphia and Prevention and Intervention Specialist with Shalom, Inc. of the Diocese of Philadelphia.
